### AWARENESS CAMPS

Awareness Camps conducted over the past five years have shown significant impact in promoting early identification and intervention for children with hearing loss. Sessions are conducted using ppts, flashcards, games and videos. Through these sustained efforts, we are now beginning to see encouraging results. The camps have empowered many ASHA workers with the knowledge to identify red flags and refer children for early screening. They have also enabled us to reach out to families in distant rural areas, spreading awareness where access to information is limited.

We regularly conduct screening camps in both community settings and hospitals to identify hearing loss in young children at the earliest stage. These camps help reach newborns, infants, and toddlers who may otherwise miss timely detection. By collaborating with government hospitals and engaging with the community directly, the centre ensures early identification and referral for intervention.

## PARENT ORIENTATION PROGRAM



A Parent Orientation Program was held on 12th April. Key guidelines, rules and essential tips were shared, with parents to enhance their child's speaking & listening journey. 44 Parents engaged actively by discussing their child's progress. The interactive session encouraged open communication, with queries addressed thoughtfully.



## INTERNAL TRAINING

Sessions were conducted from 14-16 May, covering key topics such as cochlear implants and their components, counseling, basic mapping, aided audiograms, language assessments, auditory goals, AVT, auditory training, and speech evaluation and therapy. These sessions aimed to enhance team knowledge and improve service delivery. These sessions were conducted to strengthen team expertise and enhance the quality of intervention provided.



## AVT & SPEECH THERAPY

Auditory Verbal Therapy (AVT) is to help children develop strong listening and speaking skills. The therapy focuses on four key areas: language, speech, cognition, and audition, ensuring comprehensive communication development. Currently we serve 45 children, each parent is counselled and coached for giving language to their child at home also.



From our Kalyan Centre, we serve 12 children residing in Kalyan, Bhiwandi, Mumbra, and beyond. It helps in reducing travel time and ensuring regularity.



## AUDILOGICAL INTERVENTION

We conduct hearing assessments in our Audio logical lab equipped with advanced diagnostic tools.




